### AGENDA ITEM NO. 4:

Case #P11-14 - A Public Hearing for Consideration of approval of a Rezone located NE I-40 Service Rd. & Union St. from A-1; Agricultural to C-3; Automotive and Commercial Recreation District.

Applicant: Cooper Shawnee Investments, LLC

Chairman Silvia asked for the staff report. Justin Erickson presented the staff report. Mr. Erickson informed the Commissioners that the property is immediately adjacent to an additional property that was previously rezoned to commercial for a car dealership. Justin Erickson notated that the applicant before them today was the same applicant for the previous rezoning and that they were requesting an additional five (5) acres to the north. Justin Erickson discussed the area utilized commercial development and the Comprehensive Plan designates the proposed area as an intense commercial area and therefore recommended approval of the rezone. Mr. Erickson offered to answer any questions the Commissioners may have and also informed them that the applicant has not submitted a permit or site plan as of yet but they had started grating the area. Justin Erickson discussed the applicant would be available to answer any questions on timing of the development. Vice-Chairman Salter asked if the proposed area was where the pond was previously located. Justin Erickson agreed and noted that it also went a little north as well. Chairman Silvia mentioned there were no conditions listed and asked if there were any issues regarding storm water or similar items. Mr. Erickson discussed that at this time he did not see any issues and that the applicant has pulled a permit with State. Justin Erickson also informed the Commissioners that the land is not currently platted and will be required to do so and relayed that the Planning Commission could see development concept in the near future. Chairman Silvia asked if there were any other questions for Staff. There were none and Justin Erickson was seated.

Chairman Silvia opened the public portion of the meeting and invited the representative of Cooper Shawnee Investments to come forward to answer any questions the Board may have. Bobby Dolatabadi introduced himself as an Attorney with Phillips Murrah P.C. and stated that he believed Justin Erickson stated the applicant's intent with his staff report. Commissioner Cowen asked if the applicant had a schedule in mind as to when applicant may pull permit with the City. Mr. Dolatabadi informed Commissioner Cowen they did not have a specific time frame as of yet. Chairman Silvia asked if there were any further questions from the Commissioners. There were none and Chairman Silvia proceeded to ask if there was anyone who would like to speak against the proposed rezone to come forward. There were none and Chairman Silvia closed the public portion.

## AGENDA ITEM NO. 5:

Case #S10-14 - Consideration of approval of a Preliminary Plat for Deer Field Estates located in the 1400-1500 block of E. Bradley St., Shawnee, OK

Applicant: Kishwaukee Enterprises, LLC

Chairman Silvia asked for the staff report. Justin Debruin presented the staff report. Mr. Debruin informed the Commissioners that the applicant was requesting approval on a Preliminary Plat for nineteen (19) lots, on roughly ten (10) acres and the property is currently zoned residential which is appropriate for the development. Justin Debruin also relayed the Comprehensive Plan called for residential and with these facts, Staff recommends approval with the conditions set forth. Mr. Debruin noted that a variance will be required for the culde-sac setback. Chairman Silvia asked if any issues could arise from deviating from the required setback. Justin Debruin and Justin Erickson both informed the Commissioners that the purpose of the requirement is to protect the property to the north so as to not cause any negative impact towards them. Chairman Silvia discussed the possibility of an issue with headlights shining towards the resident to the north and asked if the resident was notified of the proposal. Justin Erickson stated they were not due to plats not having a requirement to notify the surrounding property owners in a three hundred foot radius. And also mentioned that with the degree of vegetation and the height of the fences on Lots 6 & 7 for the new residences, he did not believe there would be any potential problems. Commissioner Kerbs asked if there could be a requirement applied for Lots 6 & 7 to install fences. Justin Erickson agreed if the Commissioners felt such requirement was necessary. Commissioner Cowen discussed the elevation of the property to the north was high enough to where he did not believe it would cause any issues. And the existing fence was guite tall as well. Vice-Chairman Salter asked if the cul-de-sac was approved by the fire department in order to house any fire apparatus needed. Justin Erickson confirmed this. Chairman Silvia asked if there were any other questions for Staff. There were none.

Chairman Silvia opened the public portion of the meeting and asked any representative of the proposed development to come forward. Keith Cook came forward to represent the applicant and answer any questions the Commissioners may have. Chairman

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Silvia discussed the fencing questions brought up earlier by the Commissioners and Mr. Cook stated the existing fence was around six foot to six and a half. He also discussed the proposed development would downgrade at least another two feet. There were no further questions.

Chairman Silvia asked if there were any one who would like to speak against the proposal. There were none and he proceeded to close the public portion.

Justin Erickson informed the Commissioners that Staff was contacted earlier that day by the applicant who requested deferment on the proposal until the October 1, 2014 Planning Commission meeting due to engineering challenges related to the sewer and gas lines on property and that Staff concurs with the request. Chairman Silvia proceeded to move this item to the October 1, 2014 meeting.

## AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Update on Downtown Streetscape Project

Justin Erickson introduced Michael Ludi to the Commissioners as the Assistant Engineer who would be going over the projects related to Downtown Streetscape. Michael Ludi informed the Commissioners that the project included Beard Street down to Oklahoma Street. Construction would include sidewalks being removed, water lines being replaced, stoplights being removed at four of the intersections and replaced with decorative stop signs. Bell Street is not included in this project. The intersections would mimic the current design on Bell Street with bump outs on the street that include bike racks and landscaping. Planters would go along the street. Mr. Ludi discussed that Robert Cash would be assisting Page 5 of 6 Rlanning Commission Minutes August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2014

with the landscaping designs. There would be an irrigation system in each planter for less maintenance upkeep. Michael Ludi informed the Commissioners these plans were not final and the preliminary estimates were between 2–2 ½ million. Mr. Ludi stated plans were submitted to ODOT but they are waiting for their approval before starting work hopefully in Spring of 2015. Michael Ludi asked if there were any questions he could answer. Chairman Silvia asked if where they were replacing the stop lights with stop signs that it was due to the traffic counts not requiring such. Michael Ludi agreed and stated they did a traffic count on each intersection. Chairman Silvia commented that he agreed this was a good idea. Mr. Ludi explained how the stop signs would help slow traffic flow and also discussed the amount of money saved by replacing the stop lights that ran \$125,000 a piece for the less expensive, decorative stop signs. Commissioner Kienzle asked what the time line for construction would be. Michael Ludi commented that Staff had not configured that yet but estimated around 210 days. Commissioner Kerbs asked if the island planters only included trees. Justin Erickson agreed and stated they wanted to lower maintenance upkeep. Commissioner Kerbs also asked if there was water flow between the islands and sidewalk. Michael Ludi agreed and stated they would be irrigated. Commissioner Cowen asked how much the City was paying for and how much were matching funds. Justin Erickson and Michael Ludi informed him the grant from ODOT was for \$400,000, improvement district downtown was around \$400,000 and the utility department would be paying for water lines and street department would be participating as well. Commissioner Clinard asked if while the streets were open if Staff had discussed putting fiber wiring downtown. Michael Ludi expressed that he had briefly addressed that with the IT department at one point but believed they were not in the plans. Commissioner Kerbs went on to address the electrical wiring as well and Mr. Ludi informed him that he met with OG&E regarding lighting and they have not been able to agree on anything yet. Commissioner Kienzle addressed stressing the importance to OG&E about planning for the future and what downtown could flourish to be. Michael Ludi explained how OG&E had previous issues with the discussed electrical plans and did not have great success. Commissioner Kienzle asked who would be in charge of informing the downtown merchants about which street they would be working on and when. Mr. Ludi relayed it would be himself or Justin. Commissioner Kienzle also expressed the pushing of information out to the merchants by email or text to help make it easier for the merchants. Michael Ludi informed the Commissioners he believed work would be done one block at a time and to help with placing signs for the businesses during the construction. Chairman Silvia asked if there were any other questions for the Assistant Engineer. There were none.

## AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: Planning Director's Report

Justin Erickson discussed the Oklahoma Planning Conference is October 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> in Norman and that staff would be emailing information out to the Commissioners.

Mr. Erickson proceeded to update the Commissioners on ongoing projects including the Hobby Lobby permit being released and work beginning shortly. The Aldi food permit is hoping to be going out later in the week for the Shawnee Marketplace. Staff has been busy also with other smaller commercial projects and activities including some work downtown. Mr. Erickson also discussed residential building construction is still really strong as well. Commissioner Clinard asked if Justin Erickson could explain what work was going on downtown. Mr. Erickson informed her that the Main Street market was expanding, there is a new photography studio and there has been interest on their façade grant program to improve facades for downtown buildings. Commissioner Kerbs asked how many applicants were approved. Justin Erickson stated they typically did around three or four per cycle with possibly more depending on funding availability. Mr. Erickson discussed the Shawnee Marketplace had most of the occupants for Phase 1 and Phase 2 could include a bigger store than Hobby Lobby potentially. Chairman Silvia asked if there were any other questions. There were none.

## AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Commissioners Comments and/or New Business

Chairman Silvia asked for any comments or new business. Vice-Chairman Salter mentioned making a recommendation for reducing the speed limits on Kickapoo by Interstate 40 and was unsure if it was ODOT or the Street department who could address this with Shawnee Marketplace bringing increased traffic to the area. Vice-Chairman Salter also expressed how he would like the developer of the Shawnee Marketplace to put in a road behind the east bound businesses that come out on 45<sup>th</sup> Street. Justin Erickson stated he would discuss this with the engineering department. Elizabeth Smith with the City of Shawnee spoke forward and addressed that the topic of the speed limit on Kickapoo Street did come up while she was working for the traffic department and explained that ODOT denied the request and that a petition is required. Chairman Silvia also mentioned how the City has no control over the speed limit there.

As part of the installation of public infrastructure improvements at the Shawnee Marketplace development, the developer has installed a new sewer line and abandoned the old line that existed in the vicinity of Lots 5-8 (Shawnee Marketplace Final Plat). The abandoned line was in an easement granted to the City of Shawnee by the State of Oklahoma, Commissioners of the Land Office (CLO) in 1981. The old line had to be relocated to facilitate development of the site. Now that the new line is complete, there is no need for the easement and the easement must be released so that lot owners can achieve clear title to the property.

Staff recommends release of the easement and authorization of the Mayor to sign said partial release.





#### PROPOSAL

The applicant is requesting Preliminary Plat approval for a two-phase development consisting of 68 lots on 23.88 acres of undeveloped land to facilitate the construction of a single-family housing development. The property is located one-half mile east of Harrison Street on 45<sup>th</sup> Street. The site was recently rezoned to R-1 (Single Family Residential) on July 7, 2014.

#### STAFF REVIEW AND ANALYSIS

If approved, the subject development would connect to the current Woodsong Addition, developed in 2006, and the Woodsong Garden Addition, developed in 2008. Both existing additions were developed by Bryant Builders. The requested development space was, at a time, intended for future development for the existing Woodsong Addition.

The property is approximately 23.88 acres in size and the applicant proposes 68 residential lots and one common area representing 0.867 acres in size.

Primary access to the site will be from an existing local street, Churchill Drive. The secondary access point, Kellye Green Drive, is also an existing local road with a terminus east of the subject development. A 50-foot roadway easement has been included on the preliminary plat for eventual roadway construction and an access agreement has been indicated allowing connection of Madison Avenue to Kellye Green. Staff will require such offsite road improvements be completed concurrent with Phase I infrastructure construction.

Based on review of the application, the plan for sanitary sewer appears infeasible for many lots due to topographic constraints. This issue will need to be addressed to the satisfaction of the City Engineer concurrent with Final Plat submittal and detailed grading plan will need be submitted. As the subject site is currently zoned R-1 (Single Family Residential), the construction of a single family housing development would be consistent with both the current zoning and the Shawnee Comprehensive Plan designation for the immediate area (Figure 4.2). All lots conform to the zoning standards for R-1 (Single Family Residential) and no deviations from the code are necessary at this time.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

The technical aspects of the Preliminary Plat have been reviewed by the City Engineer and other appropriate staff. Staff <u>does recommend</u> approval of the Preliminary Plat, with the following conditions:



#### PROPOSAL

The applicant is requesting Final Plat approval for 19 lots on approximately ten (10) acres of mostly undeveloped land. Currently, two residential properties exist on site and are located on lots 4 and 5. The property is located on the north-west corner of East Bradley Street and North Elm Street. The site is currently zoned R-1 (Single Family Residential) which is appropriate for the proposed housing development.

#### STAFF REVIEW AND ANALYSIS

Preliminary Plat approval for Deer Field Estates was granted by the City Commission on September 15, 2014. A total of nineteen (19) lots are proposed to facilitate a housing development. Lots 4 and 5 are currently occupied by residential properties (Exhibit 1). The following conditions were to be addressed before Final Plat approval:

- 1. A four (4') foot sidewalk shall be required along Bradley Street.
- 2. Approval from the Commission for the allowance of the cul-de-sac's terminus to be sixty-four (64') feet from the property line, as opposed to the required one-hundred (100') feet.
- 3. The addition of a limits-of-no-access along Bradley Street.

Though not shown on the final plat, addition of the four (4') foot sidewalk will be included concurrent with the installation of other public improvements.

Staff has reviewed the proposed Final Plat for Deer Field Estates and recognizes that the listed conditions have been addressed. The proposed development is consistent with current land use in the area, the designated zoning, and the Shawnee Comprehensive Plan for this area (Figure 4.2). It is for these reasons that Staff does recommend approval of the Final Plat of Deer Field Estates.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The technical aspects of the Final Plat have been reviewed by the City Engineer and other appropriate staff. Staff <u>does recommend</u> approval of the Final Plat, with the following conditions:

- 1. Final construction documents must be approved by the City Engineer prior to construction.
- 2. Prior to filing the final plat, the applicant shall commence with making the required and proposed public site improvements in accordance with construction plans approved by the City Engineer or otherwise bond the project in accordance with City code.
- 3. A four (4') foot sidewalk shall be installed along Bradley Street prior to recording of the final plat.
- 4. All other applicable City standards apply.

#### WINDSOR AMENDMENT TO THE OMRF DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN

#### <u>Nature of the Request:</u>

RE:

To amend the OMRF Defined Benefit plan to update the definition of "spouse" to be in line with the Internal Revenue Code ruling 2013-17. Due to the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals mandate to lift the stay that was previously in place regarding same sex marriages in Oklahoma, OkMRF and our Defined Benefit plan are now legally obligated to recognize same-sex marriages for Joint & Survivor and Death Benefits as well as for Federal taxation purposes. Please refer also to OMRF Memo dated September, 8, 2014 and the email update dated October 10, 2014.

## <u>Staff Analysis, Considerations:</u>

The IRS Revenue Ruling requires qualified plans (i.e. OkMRF) to recognize same sex spouses for Federal tax purposes and would affect the sections on Required Minimum Distribution Rules and Rollover Rules in the master plan. All other spousal provisions are not affected by the Windsor decision because these provisions are not required by specific code sections. Therefore, on these plan provisions, the definition of spouse will be controlled by Oklahoma law to the extent it is not preempted by federal law. These provisions are:



#### **RE:** Windsor Amendment

The OkMRF Board of Trustees, during their July 25, 2014, meeting, approved the Windsor Amendment to the Defined Benefit (DB) master plan. This amendment adds a new definition, "Spouse" and is noted as item 2.1 (mm). All subsequent definitions in the Master Plan are to be renumbered accordingly.

The attached plan amendment was prepared in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Revenue Ruling 2013-17 resulting from the United States vs. Windsor Supreme Court decision. The Windsor Amendment has to do with domestic partners, federal law and the definition of spouse. This plan amendment now needs to be approved by OkMRF members, individually, with a DB plan by **December 31, 2014**, to keep your plan in compliance with the IRC.

The IRS Revenue Ruling requires qualified plans (i.e. OkMRF) to recognize same sex spouses for <u>Federal</u> tax purposes and would affect the sections on **Required Minimum Distribution Rules** and **Rollover Rules** in the master plan. All other spousal provisions are not affected by the Windsor decision because these provisions are not required by specific code sections. Therefore, on these plan provisions, the definition of spouse will be controlled by Oklahoma law to the extent it is not preempted by federal law. These provisions are:

- Death benefits
- Survivor annuity distribution options
- Beneficiary designations
- Qualified domestic relations orders ("QDROs")

**Bottom-line**: Spouse, for Federal tax purposes, will be defined as same sex if the individuals were lawfully married under a state with laws to validate, recognize and authorize same sex marriages. Spouse, for all other provisions, will be defined as a spouse legally recognized in the State of Oklahoma (today as it stands that is opposite sex).

If the decision is overturned and Oklahoma law changes to recognize same sex marriages, your plan will still be in compliance with Federal law, State law and the master plan document.

As stated above, this amendment must be approved by your council/board by December 31, 2014. Please print 2 copies of the Amendment and after your board approves, then, return one signed original to our offices and keep the other original for your files. Defined Benefit Members of OkMRF:

This is a follow up to the Windsor Amendment email sent from our office, dated September 8, 2014, requesting your City Council or Town Board to approve the Windsor Amendment <u>on or by 12/31/14</u>. Despite the recent court developments on October 6, 2014, the Windsor Amendment is still applicable and is required by Federal law.

The only change is in the actual operation of your plan: After yesterday's 10<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court of Appeals mandate to lift the stay that was previously in place regarding same sex marriages in Oklahoma, OkMRF and your Defined Benefit plan are now legally obligated to recognize same-sex marriages for Joint & Survivor and Death Benefits as well as for Federal taxation purposes.

Additional information below is provided to help regarding the proposed amendment. Please remind your governing body they do not have to agree with the law, but as plan fiduciaries they must comply with it.

This is critical to keep your plan in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). If for some reason, your governing body should choose not to pass the amendment, after 12/31/14, the IRS could deem your plan out of compliance with the IRC. The consequence could be as severe as the entire retirement benefit becoming taxable income to each of your employees. This would be an undue tax burden to your employee group. OkMRF makes every effort to keep your plan in compliance with these laws to avoid this from happening.

I have spoken with our attorneys and we do not see a problem with any Member passing the amendment "under protest" if that is what your Council should decide to do.

The bottom-line: The amendment needs to go on an upcoming council agenda to remain in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and Federal laws <u>on or by 12/31/14</u>. Briefly summarized, the amendment accomplishes the following:

- ✓ Plan would be amended to recognize the definition of spouse as defined for Federal purposes (today Federal law recognizes same sex marriages) on Rollover and Required Minimum Distributions rules
- ✓ Plan would be amended to recognize the definition of spouse as defined for State purposes (as of yesterday State law recognizes same sex marriages) on Spousal Death benefits and Joint & Survivor benefits
- ✓ Plan remains in compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and the mandatory Windsor Amendment
- ✓ Complies with both Federal AND State law

#### For administrative purposes:

**As of yesterday:** OkMRF and your Defined Benefit plan are now legally obligated to recognize same-sex marriages. As before, a legal marriage license will be necessary, for proof of spouse for Joint & Survivor and Death Benefit purposes. **Bottom-line:** Same-sex marriages are now given all the rights and privileges as opposite sex marriages for all purposes.

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#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT SYSTEM, DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA, TO INCORPORATE THE DEFINITION OF SPOUSE; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE, PROVIDING FOR REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. **AMENDATORY.** The Employee Retirement System, Defined Benefit Plan of the City of Shawnee, is hereby amended, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned, Subsection 2.1(mm) of the Oklahoma Municipal Retirement Fund Master Defined Benefit Plan (the "Plan") is hereby amended to read as follows and to renumber the current Subsection (mm) and the subsequent Subsections accordingly:

"(mm) **Spouse:** Effective as of June 26, 2013 and in accordance with Revenue Ruling 2013-17 and IRS Notice 2014-19, for Federal tax purposes which may apply to qualified retirement plans under Code Section 401(a), the terms 'spouse,' 'husband,' and 'wife' include an individual married to a person of the same sex if the individuals are lawfully married under state law, and the term "marriage" includes such marriage between individuals of the same sex, and a marriage of same-sex individuals that was validly entered into in a state whose laws authorize the marriage of two individuals of the same sex even if the married couple is domiciled in a state that does not recognize the validity of same-sex marriages. For all other Plan purposes and which are not required for Federal tax purposes as described in the preceding sentence, the term 'spouse' will be defined as a spouse which is legally recognized in the State of Oklahoma."

Except as otherwise provided in this Windsor Amendment to the Oklahoma Municipal Retirement Fund Master Defined Benefit Plan ("Amendment"), the Plan is hereby ratified and confirmed in all respects. This Amendment shall be effective as of June 26, 2013.

Section 2. **REPEALER.** All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. **SEVERABILITY.** If any part, article, section, or subsection of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance, notwithstanding such holding.

Section 4. **EMERGENCY.** It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Shawnee and the inhabitants thereof that this ordinance be put into full force and effect, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

The City shall contribute to the Oklahoma Municipal Retirement Fund (OMRF) on behalf on the Manager, solely for his benefit, a percentage of his salary equal to that of other department heads, in addition to the salary provided for in Sections 3A. <u>The retirement for the Manager vests</u> immediately upon his commencing employment with the City.

The current OMRF vesting for the Defined Benefit plan and Defined Contribution 5-10-15 plan allow vesting after seven (7) years of service. The Defined Contribution Special Incentive plan allows for vesting after 5 years service. This is not what was agreed to at the time of the City Manager's contract.

#### Staff Analysis, Considerations:


In order to rectify the discrepancy between OMRF vesting requirements and the City Manager's contract, we need to amend the Defined Benefit, Defined Contribution 5-10-15 and the Defined Contribution Special incentive plans.

#### <u>Recommendation:</u>

I recommend that we adopt the amendments prepared by OMRF to correct the discrepancy between the City Manager's contract and the current plan documents. This will only affect Brian McDougal—not any future City Managers. This way the commission will have the ability to negotiate this with any future City Managers that are hired for the City.

#### **Budget Consideration:**


Technically there is no budget impact. The City will continue to pay the current percentages of pay for the City Manager as they are now. The only impact would be on the OMRF plans—but this would be minimal. The City

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT SYSTEM, **DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN FOR CITY OF SHAWNEE**, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES OF **CITY OF SHAWNEE**, OKLAHOMA; PERTAINING TO DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEE; PERTAINING TO ELIGIBILITY; PROVIDING FOR EMPLOYER PICKUP OF MANDATORY CONTRIBUTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE DETERMINATION OF VESTING FOR CITY MANAGER; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA.

Section 1. AMENDATORY. The Employee Retirement System, Defined Benefit Plan, of the City of Shawnee, Oklahoma, is hereby amended as reflected on the attached Exhibit "A", which is incorporated herein and adopted by reference. These amendments shall become effective on November 1, 2014.

**Section 2.       - An employee hired at age 30 who worked for 25 years and terminated at age 55 would be entitled to unreduced payments at age 65.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT SYSTEM, DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PLAN FOR THE POSITION OF DEPARTMENT HEAD OR CITY MANAGER FOR THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING FOR THE DETERMINATION OF VESTING FOR CITY MANAGER; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA.

Section 1. AMENDATORY. The Employee Retirement System, Defined Contribution Plan, of the City of Shawnee, Oklahoma, is hereby amended as reflected on the attached Exhibit "A", which is incorporated herein and adopted by reference. These amendments shall become effective on November 1, 2014.

**Section 2. EXECUTION AUTHORIZATION.** The City Clerk and Mayor be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute the amended Retirement System Plan documents and to do all the other acts necessary to put said amendment into effect and to maintain IRS qualification of the Plan. **City of Shawnee**, a city, town, agency, instrumentality, or public trust located in the State of Oklahoma, with its principal office at Shawnee, Oklahoma, hereby establishes a Defined Contribution Plan to be known as the **City of Shawnee Special Incentive Plan** (the "Plan") in the form of the Oklahoma Municipal Retirement Fund Master Defined Contribution Plan.

# Nature of the Request:

To request permission to apply for and submit a letter of intent to the Avedis Foundation for funding for the Splash Pad at Boy Scout Park.

# **Staff Analysis, Considerations:**

The Avedis Foundation has opened up their grant cycle and we would like to apply for the Splash Pad for Boys Scout Park. Cost is approximately \$400,000 and we would be asking the Avedis Foundation for \$200,000 of the cost. The City would be responsible for the rest- We have applied for another grant to fund this project for \$110,000 from the Tobacco Settlement Trust, but we won't know if we have been awarded until February. If this is awarded the City would only need to put in \$90,000 into the project.

# <u>Recommendation:</u>

Staff is recommending that the commission approve moving forward and applying for the grant.

# Budget Consideration:

Should the City receive the funding for this project the matching funds would come from fund balance of the General Fund and we would do an inter-fund loan to the capital fund until the Expo loan in capital paid off (Dec 2015) and then we would pay back the General Fund.




