

#### Nature of the Request:

To obtain permission to order new fire engine.

#### Staff Analysis, Considerations:

Staff is requesting permission to order a new fire engine from Conrad Fire Equipment (manufactured by Pierce Manufacturing) through the Houston/Galveston Area Council government purchasing contract at a total cost (including equipment) of \$583,494.00. Specifically, the order will be for a Pierce PUC (Pierce Ultimate Configuration) Rescue Pumper with DASH cab, 1250 gallon per minute pump and 1,000 gallon water tank (very similar to the one pictured below from Bixby, OK):



The purchase of this new apparatus will allow us to retire a worn-out 1989 pumper that is currently serving as our sole back-up unit and move a 1997 pumper into the back-up role. We have designed this apparatus to allow for additional storage for rescue equipment (to include a full set of hydraulic extrication equipment) while still providing exceptional pumping capability, hose storage and tank capacity. Our plan will be to house this unit at Station #3 (306 E. MacArthur) to position this apparatus near Interstate 40 and many of our industrial facilities. This unit will take approximately one year to build from the date of order.

#### <u>Recommendation:</u>

Staff is recommending approval be given to order the new fire engine.

#### Budget Consideration:

During fiscal year 2014-2015 there was a budget line item for a new apparatus for \$465,000. The truck that we ordered and just received cost less than budgeted for so we currently have roughly \$270,000 to put towards this truck. The Truck was less than we had budgeted for because the Fire Department ordered a truck that better suited their needs. The Fire Department also get money from the county every year and we currently have \$90,000 that could go towards the purchase of the new truck. Since the truck takes about a year to receive from the day of order we would rollover the current money into next year and would have to budget the additional \$223,000 in fiscal year 2015-2016. If needed there should be an additional \$40k from the county next fiscal year. We will have some debt paid off next December so staff feels that this would not but a hardship on the capital fund next year.

## SUMMARY




Figure 1: Aerial view of subject property.

On November 13, 2014 an Administrative Order was issued requiring the dismantling and removal of a residential structure located at 645 N. Broadway (Figure 1). A public hearing was held at 9:15 AM on November 13 and the legal owner, Timothy Thomas was not present. It was determined that the structure met the statutory definition of "dilapidated" and that the public interest would be best served by removal of the building.

Shawnee Municipal Code provides in Section 7-582(a)(6) that:

The property owner shall have the right of appeal to the city commission from any order of the community development director. Such appeal shall be taken by filing written notice of appeal, clearly stating all grounds upon which the appeal is based, with the city clerk within ten days after the administrative order is rendered.

Mr. Thomas appealed the decision of the Administrative Hearing Officer on November 21, 2014.

## BACKGROUND

Photographs are attached that indicate the condition of the property (Exhibit 1). In summary, the property is in a severe state of disrepair due to a lack of maintenance. There are significant structural deficiencies with the property and it has been unsecured and open at various times over the last few months. It also does not meet basic property maintenance standards and has nuisance code violations. Extensive repairs would be required to make the two units fit for occupancy.

The structure is setup as a duplex and one unit (645) has not had water service since December 2012, while the other unit (645<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>) has not had service since July 2014. According to County records, property taxes were not paid in 2013. The property owner paid \$18,500 for the structure in 2005.

The initial condemnation hearing was held on August 14, 2014. Mr. Thomas indicated at that hearing that he planned to remodel the building. The hearing was recessed until November 13 to provide Mr. Thomas time to obtain a remodel permit and begin repairs. A remodel permit was not subsequently applied for and the structure has not improved in condition.

According to the Pottawatomie County Assessor, the building is 2,360 square feet and was constructed in 1930.

# RECOMMENDATION

In his appeal letter, Mr. Thomas notes that he has a contract with an individual to purchase the property. If a new owner will remove or substantially rehabilitate the structure, Staff has <u>no objection</u> to a "stay order" that would put the condemnation on hold, while such repairs are underway or while the structure is demolished.


Absent a buyer for the property, staff recommends denial of the appeal. Mr. Thomas has not shown a good-faith effort to address any of the violations of the subject property and he has had more than four (4) months since the initial hearing to take action.

This report is for the main dwelling.

Notice has been given to the property owner on file at the county courthouse that the above-described property has been reported as being a dilapidated structure. An inspection has been made on the site and the following conditions were noted:

Conditions: I find the property appears to have a dilapidated structure. This property is in a state of damage and decay due to a lack of maintenance. The main structure on this property is open for vagrant occupancy and has become an attractive nuisance for children. The structure is an "Unsecured Structure" as per City of Shawnee Municipal Code Section 7-583

Unsecured building means any structure that is not occupied by a legal or equitable owner thereof or by a lessee of a legal or equitable owner and into which there are one or more unsecured openings such as broken windows, unlocked windows, broken doors, unlocked doors, holes in exterior walls, holes in the roof, broken basement or cellar hatchways, unlocked basement or cellar hatchways or other similar unsecured openings which would facilitate an unauthorized entry into the structure.

Due to the unsecured condition of the structure and the structural injury caused by the lack of maintenance, the structure appears to meet the requirements of a "Dilapidated Structure" as per City of Shawnee Municipal Code Section 7-581. As for the above-mentioned conditions, the property has become detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the general public and the community. The conditions of all structures are a fire hazard to the surrounding community and the removal of such conditions would be beneficial. All trash and debris inside and out of the structure, if any, shall be removed from the property and this office shall order the utilities removed. All brush and vegetation shall be removed from the lot immediately.





# NATURE OF REQUEST

A request has been submitted by BP Union Affordable Housing Partners LP for a *Resolution of Support* for an affordable housing development consisting of:

- Conversion and historic rehabilitation of the former ACH Hospital building (14 E. 9<sup>th</sup> Street) into six housing units;
- Construction of 24 single-family detached units in the 3500 Block (approximate) of N. Union Street.

# **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

A resolution of support from the local governing body is a required element of the tax credit application process administered by the Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency (OHFA). The purpose of the Oklahoma Affordable Housing Tax Credit program is to expand the supply of new affordable rental units and rehabilitate existing rental housing for qualifying households by stimulating private investment. Eligible activities include:

- 1. Substantial rehabilitation;
- 2. Acquisition/substantial rehabilitation;
- 3. Acquisition/substantial rehabilitation/new construction; or
- 4. New construction.

The proposed project includes new construction and acquisition/substantial rehabilitation. The new units are to consist of 24 single-family residences (3 bed, 2 bath, ~1,400 square foot units with two car garages) that would be constructed in the 3500 Block of N. Union, north of the Margaret Manor housing complex, which is north of the Cedar Terrace Apartments. The second element of the proposal involves the rehabilitation of the former ACH Hospital building in downtown Shawnee into six housing units. This would represent the most substantial residential development downtown since the Aldridge Hotel was renovated in 2006.

Because tax credits are being sought from the Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency, the development is subject to applicable income and rent limitations. The project will serve individuals and families with incomes at or below 60% of the area median income. The income and rent limits for the proposed project are attached. The income limit for a family of four (4) is \$31,500, which is equivalent to an hourly wage of \$15.14 per hour over a standard work year.

The City of Shawnee has received several requests for "resolutions of support" from developers seeking tax credits for residential development in recent months. No tax credits have been awarded to Shawnee projects over the last year and it is unlikely that multiple applications would be approved under the current funding cycle.

There is a legitimate question of demand/need relative to affordable units. The City's Urban Renewal Authority has commissioned several housing studies, but all utilized 2000 U.S. Census data rather than the updated 2010 data (all were completed prior to release of the new data). The City will have an updated Consolidated Housing Plan in mid-2015, which will provide an updated picture of need in the community. The developer may have market data that they can share with the City Commission to better address the demand question. The subject request is for a total of 30 units, which is a small to medium-sized project. The most recent previous request (Excel Development) was for 26 units.

Examining the 2013 American Community Survey data (U.S. Census Bureau), we find that the poverty rate in Shawnee is estimated to be 23.8% overall and for families with related children under age 18, the poverty rate is estimated at 27.3 percent. In female-only households (no husband present) with children under 18, the estimated poverty rate is 51.8%. The median household income in Shawnee is \$35,619, while the median income of families is \$44,832.

With the above poverty and income figures considered, it is clear that there are thousands of individuals and families in Shawnee that would meet the income qualifications for this and other affordable housing developments. That does not necessarily mean that there are not enough existing housing units to meet the demand, but the overall size of the project suggests that it would not be difficult to absorb the additional units into the Shawnee rental housing market.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the resolution of support for affordable housing.

## **BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS**

The tax credits associated with this project are at the State and Federal level. There are no tax ramifications to the City or County. It is staff's understanding, that the project is subject to the same local taxes and fees as any non-tax credit project would be, including property tax.



## MEMORANDUM

To: City of Shawnee Commissioners

Since the Commission was unable to agree on an ordinance for citizen participation on December 1, I have made some changes that I hope will allay the concerns of some Commissioners. That ordinance is on the agenda for December 15, with the proposed changes highlighted in yellow. These are the changes:

The ordinance maintains our existing policy of having citizens come to the podium and sign in. It limits the citizen to 3 minutes, but allows 12 minutes for a topic with a maximum of 24 minutes for all comments, regardless of the number of topics.

The Citizens' Comments have been moved from just prior to the regular business of the meeting to be just before the Commissioner Comments, which will give Commissioners an opportunity to respond. Regular business would then follow Commissioner Comments.

In the section setting out the rules to be observed by citizen speakers, I have added that citizens are prohibited from making comments about any candidate issue on a ballot, arbitration, or litigation.

The final change is in the paragraph related to Commissioner interaction with citizens.

I hope that with these changes, we can allow citizens comments during our meeting with respect and an orderly meeting for the Commission and the citizens.

### ORDINANCE NO.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE II, DIVISION 1 OF THE SHAWNEE MUNICIPAL CODE BY ENACTING A NEW SECTION PROVIDING FOR CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AT CITY COMMISSION MEETINGS, PROVIDING FOR REPEAL, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Shawnee seeks to establish fair, reasonable, and efficient guidelines for maintaining order and promoting effective public participation at City Commission meetings; and

WHEREAS, The City of Shawnee encourages participation from its citizens in public meetings;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SHAWNEE, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Shawnee Municipal Code is amended by a new section to read as follows: It is the intent and purpose of the City of Shawnee by adoption of this ordinance to ensure that persons desiring to address the City Commission on matters pertaining to public business are afforded an opportunity to do so.

At every regular City Commission meeting, a time for Citizen Participation shall be placed on the agenda just before Commissioners Comments and before the Commission takes up its regular business. Citizen Participation shall be limited to that portion of the meeting except when related to Public Hearings.

Citizen comments are limited to 12 minutes per topic and 24 minutes per meeting unless an extension is proposed by a commission member and approved by a majority of Commission members.

Citizens wishing to address the City Commission in accordance with this ordinance shall abide by the following rules:

- 1) Stand and be recognized by the Mayor or Presiding Officer.
- 2) Approach the podium, state name, and sign the sign-in sheet.
- 3) Distribute any handouts to the City Commission and City Clerk.
- 4) Restrict comments to public business, whether or not on the agenda. Speaking for or against candidates for public office, issues on a ballot pending an election, and city business involving arbitration or litigation are prohibited.
- 5) State whether speaking as an individual or for a group or organization.
- 6) Address comments to the Commission as a body, not to any member thereof.
- 7) Address questions to the Mayor or Presiding Officer.
- 8) Speak respectfully. Profanity and personal attacks will not be tolerated.
- 9) Limit comments to 3 minutes.

City Commission members shall not enter into a dialogue with the speaker during the speaker's allotted time except to ask for clarification. After the speaker leaves the podium and before the next speaker is called, commissioners may respond to speaker's comments, subject to rules of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

The City Commission will take no action on matters presented during Citizens Participation. Questions may be referred to the City Manager for an answer, or the matter may be placed on a future meeting agenda.

Speakers may not speak with Commission members after leaving the podium and may not speak from their seat unless called upon by the Mayor or Presiding Officer.

If any citizen violates these rules, the Mayor may declare the speaker out of order and retake the floor. If the speaker does not comply, they may be asked to leave or if necessary, escorted from the meeting.

Section 2. REPEALER. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 3. CODIFICATION</u>. This ordinance shall be codified in Chapter Two, Article II, Division 1 of the Shawnee Municipal code with a section number set by the codifier.

**Section 4. SEVERABILITY**. If any part, article, section, or subsection of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance, notwithstanding such holding.

**Section 5. EMERGENCY**. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Shawnee and the inhabitants thereof that this ordinance be put into full force and effect, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.




