
The project we bid out is a quantity based project, and we do as much work as the budgeted money allows. Attached is a map showing locations that will be targeting for this years project.

NATURE OF THE REQUEST:

I am writing to request your approval for staff to execute an agreement with the North Rock Creek Public Schools for use of their facility as a public storm shelter. A copy of the agreement is attached for your reference.

STAFF ANALYSIS / CONSIDERATIONS:

The North Rock Creek School system is offering us the use of the Safe Rooms in the Middle School as public tornado shelters during those times when school children are not present at the facility. The safe rooms were designed and constructed to the FEMA safe room standard. I have coordinated with Blake Moody, Superintendent of Schools, who escorted me as we performed a walk-through inspection of the facility and found it suitable for use.

We have volunteer Shelter Monitors who live close by who would be assigned along with School personnel when we utilize the facility.

The City Attorney has reviewed the documents and approves them as to form.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval.

BUDGET CONSIDERATION:

There is no charge for the use of the facilities.

AGREEMENT FOR THE USE OF A BUILDING AS A PUBLIC TORNADO SHELTER

This Agreement is made and entered into between the City of Shawnee, Oklahoma, a municipal corporation, and North Rock Creek Public Schools.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Interlocal Cooperation Act, Title 74 Oklahoma Statutes Section 1001 et. Seq., authorizes local government units to cooperate in order to provide services and facilities that will accord best with geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs and development of local communities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Shawnee, Oklahoma, hereinafter referred to as the "City", desires to operate public tornado shelters for the protection of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education for North Rock Creek Public Schools, hereinafter referred to as the "Board" owns certain property located at 42400 Garrett's Lake Road, Shawnee, OK 74804, hereinafter referred to as the "Facility"; and

WHEREAS, the Board has offered the use of the Facility for emergency public tornado shelter needs;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1. This agreement shall become effective upon adoption and shall remain in effect until termination by either one of the parties. Either party may terminate the agreement upon 30 days' written notice to the other party.

Section 2. The point of contact for the City is the City Manager. The address for correspondence is P.O. Box 1448, Shawnee, OK 74802. The telephone number is 405-878-1601.

Section 3. The point of contact for the Board is the Superintendent of Schools. The address for correspondence is 42400 Garrett's Lake Road, Shawnee, OK 74804. The telephone number is 405-273-1798.

Section 4. Both parties agree that for coordination and operational purposes, the points of contact may assign responsibilities for execution of the provisions of this agreement to staff members. These persons will hereinafter be referred to as the "Coordinators."

Section 5. The Coordinators will jointly conduct a pre-inspection survey of the Facility before the City operates the tornado shelter. The pre-inspection survey will be used to identify and record any existing damage or conditions.

Section 6. The Board will secure all equipment and contents that are not supposed to be used by the City in the operation of the Facility.

Section 7. The Board agrees to provide and pay for utility services, including electricity and heating to the facility.

Section 8. As part of the emergency nature of the services required, the Board agrees that the facility shall be available seven (7) days/week except when school is in session and occupied by students.

Section 9. The City has primary responsibility for the operation of the public tornado shelter. The City will provide staff and volunteers to carry out the activities of the shelter. The City will post signs identifying the Shelter. The City will remove all signs upon termination of this agreement. The City and all of its agents, employees, and volunteers will exercise reasonable care in the operation of the shelter.

Section 10. Shelter population shall be exclusively the role of City. The Board shall not distribute or reveal any information concerning occupants of the shelter without the express written consent of the City.

Section 11. Storm damage or other damage caused to the Facility by the emergency is the responsibility of the Board.

Section 12. Property damaged, lost or stolen due to the negligence of the City will be compensated based on depreciated actual cash value. Reimbursement for any extraordinary or capital expenses (including without limitation, paintings, carpeting, wiring, and structural work) will be limited to replacement at actual cash value of the property. In such cases, the City may solicit bids from at least three reputable contractors for the repair/replacement.

Section 13. At the time of the adoption of this agreement, Title 51 Oklahoma Statutes, Chapter 5 Section 155 Sub-Section 36 provides tort liability protection to any governmental agency that uses a public facility opened to the general public during an emergency. If so desired, the Board shall carry any Commercial General Liability insurance coverage on the Facility it deems appropriate.

Section 14. The City shall carry Workman's Compensation and Employer Liability Insurance on its workers operating the shelter.

Section 15. This Agreement and any disputes relating to it shall be construed under Oklahoma Law.

Section 16. Any Amendments to this Agreement must be made in writing and signed by both parties.

Section 17. If any of the provisions in this Agreement are determined to be in violation of State or Federal Law, said provisions shall be interpreted so as to be in compliance with such Law or said Provisions shall fall out this Agreement, but otherwise, the Agreement shall be unaffected and shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 18. The City and the Board agree that both parties have played an equal and reciprocal part in drafting of this Agreement. Therefore, no provisions of the Agreement shall be construed by any court or other authority against any party hereto because such party is deemed to have drafted or structured such provisions.

Section 19. Nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person, firm or corporation other than the parties hereto, any right, remedy or claim, legal or equitable, under or by reason of this Agreement or any provision hereof, this Agreement and all of its provisions being intended to be and being for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto. In addition, nothing contained herein shall be construed to create any partnership, joint venture or other relationship between the parties with respect to the emergency shelter or to authorize any party to bid for or undertake or offer any contracts for any other party or act as agent for the other party except as and to the extent expressly permitted herein.

Section 20. This Agreement does not create a landlord/tenant relationship, but constitutes a mere license in favor of the City to use portions of the Facility in common with the Board in strict accordance with the terms and conditions herein provided.

Section 21. The persons executing this agreement on behalf of their respective entities hereby represent and warrant that they have the right, power, legal capacity, and appropriate authority to enter into this agreement on behalf of the entity for which they sign.

Dear Mr. McDougal:

As you are aware, Oklahoma Baptist University is in the process of building additional residential facilities for its anticipated growth in the student body over the next several years. In reviewing the master plan and the location of the proposed residential facilities, the existing Raley Drive located on the Oklahoma Baptist University campus needs to be moved to the east.

Recently I visited with John Krywicki and learned Raley Drive was an easement as opposed to a dedicated street. In September of 2005, Oklahoma Baptist University gave an easement to the City of Shawnee on the following described real property, towit:

A road easement described as starting at the Southwest Corner of the Southeast Quarter (SE½) of the Southeast Quarter (SE½) of Section 1, T1ON, R3E of the Indian Meridian, Pottawatomie County, Oklahoma thence N00°40'46"W for a distance of 40 feet; thence S89°19'14"W for a distance of 23.16 feet to the Point of Beginning (POB); thence N00°40'46"W for a distance of 622.44 feet; thence S88°14'33"W for a distance of 60.00 feet; thence S00°40148"E for a distance of 622.44 feet, thence N89°19'14"E for a distance of 60.00 feet to the Point of Beginning (POB), said described parcel containing 0.81 acres, more or less.

The easement is dated the 20th day of September, 2005 and was recorded on the 22nd day of September, 2005 as instrument number 200500013653 in the Office of the




